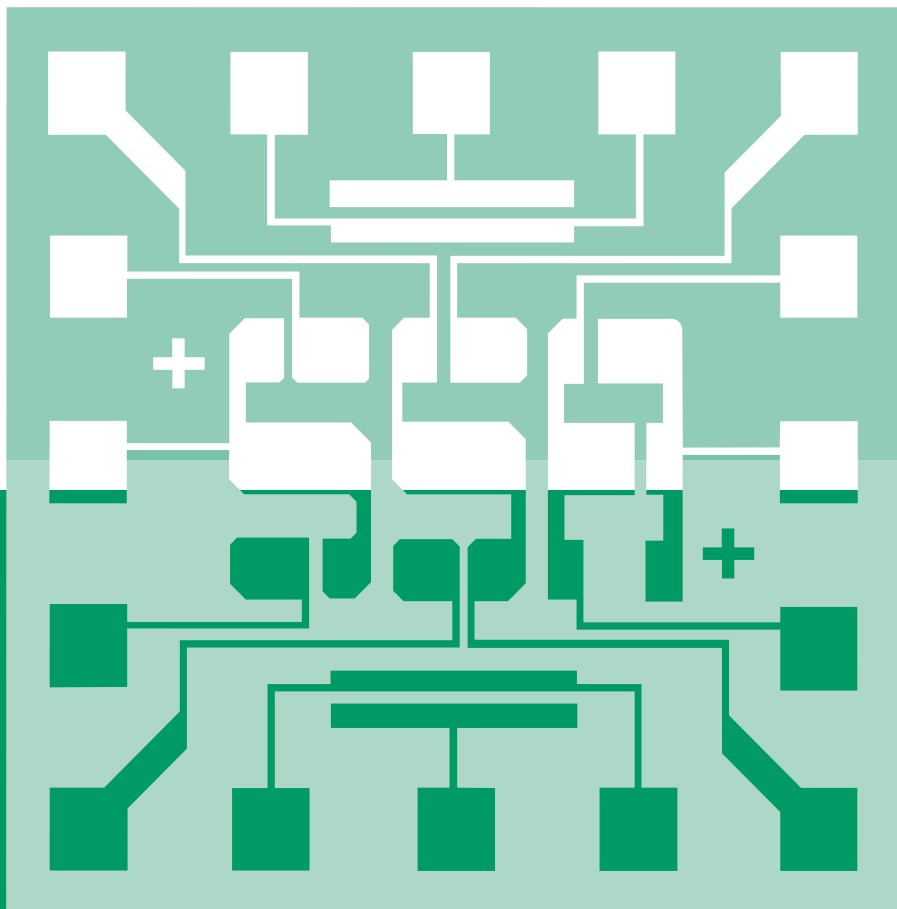

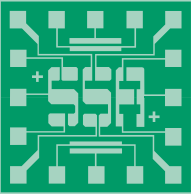

## HOTEL INFORMATION

### Hotel Accommodation

The Registration fee does **not** include hotel accommodation. Delegates are required to make their own arrangements for accommodation, but a number of rooms have been reserved for Conference Delegates at the Grand Hotel Brun at a special Conference rate. Early booking is strongly advised, as the number of rooms available is limited. Conference Delegates may wish to make reservations using the accompanying Hotel Reservation Form, which must be sent directly to the Hotel.

If hotel registration is made by telephone or fax, please be sure to make reference to the SSA(Europe) Conference. The special room rate is 275,000 Lire per person per room per night for bed and breakfast. The cost of a double room is 350,000 Lire per room per night for bed and breakfast.

### Location

#### By Car

Situated on the outskirts of Milan in the San Siro neighbourhood 3km from the Fiera exit of the Tangenziale Ovest highway.

#### By Air

Access from either Malpensa (30km) or Linate (12km). Delegates travelling to Malpensa need to take the Malpensa Express to Stazione Nord (Cadorna) then taxi to hotel.
